Tina Shelton of Pomona has been on a "winning streak" like no other. For 365 consecutive days, she's found coins and/or dollar bills in both likely and unlikely places – from the pavement to inside vacuum cleaners – each with special meaning attached. She's celebrating the unbelievable milestone on **Saturday**, December 19 at JC Penney in Whittier with a special donation to The Salvation Army's Red Kettle Campaign. In addition to donating more than 3,400 coins/dollar bills - totaling more than \$160 - the journey has inspired a daily blog and website - www.pennyfinders.com, as well as inspired a new guidebook – encouraging others to discover the joy of finding and giving back.

The Salvation Army in Southern California raises 60 percent of its annual operating budget during the holidays, making this a critical season for bringing in much-needed resources. Despite the economy, public support has been steadfast, but for The Salvation Army to reach its \$2 million Red **Kettle Campaign goal**, more support is needed. The kettles have brought in \$1 million so far, leaving just days for kettles to raise \$1 million more.

Other "PennyFinders" have agreed to triple Shelton's coin gift, bringing the total to just over \$500. The public is encouraged to follow her lead by giving their piggy bank collections during the final days of the campaign.
